The successful candidate will represent the Company through interaction with environmental regulatory agencies to obtain water quality permits. The candidate will also conduct negotiations related to enforcement actions or other correspondence with regulatory agencies, typically with the US Army Corps of Engineers, Regional Water Quality Control Boards and/or State Water Resources Control Board and California Department of Fish & Game. Additional responsibilities will include preparing internal guidance documents and procedures related to Wetland Delineation and Waste Discharge Requirements. Collaborating with other Corporate Environment, Health and Safety sections on 401/404 permitting issues in their relation to natural resources protection and to assess and implement company programmatic agreement needs in the natural resources area. Reviewing and commenting on proposed legislation and regulations; providing guidance to SCE business units on new environmental requirements related to 401/404 permitting and wetland delineation and jurisdictional water determinations. Assisting business units with effective training, internal audit preparation and developing Corrective Action Plans. Responding to agency notices on all wetland issues, performing site or field inspections for determining jurisdiction of various permitting agencies. Participating in the oil spill notification/response team; some after hours and on call duty required. Candidate will also assist with leading internal teams which cross organizational boundaries to address emerging company issues in the areas of 401/404 Permitting and Water Quality, providing interpretative compliance guidance of jurisdictional water determination and water quality regulations that apply to specific company operations and projects; and performing other duties and responsibilities.
